






Activities on the construction site are and will continue to observe and adhere to local, provincial and federal health orders and guidelines.

Site-specific safety measures currently implemented at the construction site:

- All workers have their temperatures checked prior to entering the construction site
- A full-time medic remains on site
- Mandatory face masks and social distancing are required when appropriate
- Completion of the Preventative Measures Questionnaire at the end of each shift
- Completion of the COVID-19 Orientation Questionnaire by all workers and delivery drivers upon arrival to site










Construction Update

- Construction will wrap up late in December 2020, right before Christmas time
- Construction will begin again in 2021 either right before or right after the New Year
- There will be some night shifts taking place to speed up the construction process
- Deliveries of the turbine components will be completed by the end of February 2021
- Aiming to reach the Commercial Operation Date (COD) by March 2021
- Prior to COD, various tests will be completed:
 - Commissioning tests
 - Performance tests
 - Availability tests
 - Power curve tests
 - Tests on electrical system






Review of Action Items from CLC Meeting #3

No action items were identified from CLC Meeting #3






Review of Submitted Questions


Questions sent in advance of the CLC meeting:

- 1. Inquiry from a local construction company on potential opportunity to work on the project
- 2. One of the CLC members requested an update on the construction status in August 2020, specifically with regards to getting components to site and staff getting sent home.
- Inquiry from a member of the public about the crane company and opportunity for a crane operator apprenticeship.
- 4. A member of the public expressed concerns about the distance of the turbines to town, the state of Leeville Street due to construction, and the environmental impacts of the turbines on birds.
- 5. A photographer commissioned by the Globe and Mail requested permission to take photos of the project.
- 6. A member of the public expressed concerns about the turbines' impact on the geese.




RE: Potential opportunity to work on the Project

The local construction company's information was passed on to Juergen Kraus, the Wind Construction Coordinator, who has reached out to discuss potential opportunities. No follow up was required.




RE: Construction schedule and delays (August 2020)

The Project has experienced delays as it navigates constructing through a global pandemic, but we are making every effort to catch up and finish the project early in 2021. We continue to receive turbine components which will allow us to increase our crew size to the original plan.



RE: Crane company and opportunity for a crane operator apprenticeship

Cathy Zhao provided the crane company's name and the company's website to the member of the public. The website listed the company's contact information and available positions. No follow up was required.




RE: Concerns about distance from the turbines, the state of Leeville Street, and impact on birds

At Golden South, we're following the required setbacks from noise receptors, such as houses, and the provincial regulations on sound-levels:

- The closest non-participating landowner residence is 900 metres away from a turbine
- Modelled sound levels are limited to a level that is typically no more than 40dBA, as instructed by the province

We are aware that Leeville Road has experienced heavy use as a result of the GS project construction. Given the heavy loads required of a project of this size, and the large components, it is expected that the road will be impacted. This is why we entered into an agreement with the Town of Assiniboia to pay for both the road maintenance and capital loss use.


RE: Concerns about distance from the turbines, the state of Leeville Street, and impact on birds

As for the impacts on birds, we have undertaken numerous studies to assess the potential environmental effects of the project and to minimize these potential effects.

As part of our permitting process, we have conducted pre-construction spring and fall migration surveys for the migratory birds to confirm the best siting processes and locations. The surveys and results were reviewed and approved by the Saskatchewan Ministry of the Environment. The survey methods included actual on-the-ground assessments at and surrounding the proposed turbine locations within the project area.


We have also committed to conducting post-construction surveys as described in Saskatchewan's Adaptive Management Guidelines for Saskatchewan Wind Energy Projects, which identifies fatality levels that trigger further action to reduce impacts for different bird species.

It is important to note that while the project will almost certainly injure or kill individual birds, leading conservation societies like the Audubon Society of America recognize that climate change is a greater threat to bird populations than the potential local impacts caused by wind turbines.



RE: Photographer's request

Juergen Kraus, PRI's Wind Construction Coordinator, contacted the photographer on October 29, 2020, and they completed a site visit on November 4, 2020. Photos were taken and no follow up was required.




RE: Concern about the turbines' impact on geese

We understand your concern for the geese, and we have undertaken numerous studies to assess the potential environmental effects of the project and to minimize these potential effects.

We are unable to guarantee that the project will not affect geese, however, data from other projects and from published literature indicates that geese have a 95-99% avoidance rate of turbines in flight, so we expect mortality rates from collisions with turbines to be low for geese (certainly a tiny fraction of the bag limits allowed for the hunting of geese in the area).

Furthermore, should post-construction monitoring surveys find that geese are being impacted by the turbines, there are mitigation options available if required by the Ministry of the Environment. All of the information obtained from the studies as well as the proposed mitigation measures have been provided to the Ministry of Environment and were approved.






